October Duties for Seniors!



Chances are that you will need to submit at least one essay with each college application. Start to develop outlines this month.

If you decide to visit colleges, ask the counseling office for the names of former students in your area who have enrolled at those colleges or have recently graduated from them. If possible, talk to these people before your visit. Decide who you are going to ask for recommendations, and ask them now, if you have not already done so. When you ask, provide your **MVHS Brag Sheet**, a stamped return envelope, together with the appropriate college forms and a resume. Be sure to allow plenty of time for them to complete the letter so that they do not feel rushed. Check the counseling center for books and pamphlets about financial aide and look for federal, state and local programs from which you may be able to receive aid. Update the information you obtained during your junior year on private scholarship opportunities. Start applying for private scholarships now since they typically have early deadlines.

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The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA, is the primary form students and their families need to file to get need-based financial aid for college, but it is not as scary or daunting as you may think. After all, it's free to file, so you have nothing to lose and everything to gain by completing this form online. (Just remember this is aid awarded based on your financial need. You should also be applying for other scholarships—and applying like crazy!)

University Honors and Leadership Program

This highly selective program does not admit more than 40 incoming freshman students each fall. Successful applicants usually fall in the top ten percent of their class and are intellectually curious and thrive in an educational environment which presents new ways of viewing the world, as well as themselves. The UHL program's unique, multidisciplinary curriculum allows outstanding students to pursue a traditional aca-

demical honors experience or an honors program in leadership studies alongside their chosen major. As the UHL program courses satisfy 27+ credit hours of the required university core curriculum, it does not add to the hours required for graduation from CU Denver. In addition, each student admitted to the UHL program receives an annual base scholarship of \$2,500 per year for four years (conditioned on maintaining good standing in the UHL program). Applicants

Deadline for priority admission is February 3rd, for regular admission March 30th 2017.

Coca-Cola Scholars Program Scholarship

The Coca-Cola Scholars Program Scholarship is an achievement-based scholarship awarded to graduating high school seniors each year. Students are recognized for their capacity to lead and serve, and their commitment to making a significant impact on their schools and communities. With the 27th class in 2015, the Foundation has provided over 5,5500 Coca-Cola Scholars with more than \$56 million in educational support. 150 Coca-Cola Scholars are selected each year to receive this \$20,000 scholarship.

Applicants must be:

- Current high school (or home-schooled) seniors attending school in the United States (or select DoD schools);
- US Citizens; U.S. Nationals; U.S. Permanent Residents; Refugees; Asylees; Cuban-Haitian Entrants; or Humanitarian Parolees;
- Anticipating completion of high school diploma at the time of application;
- Planning to pursue a degree at an accredited U.S. post-secondary institution;
- Carrying a minimum 3.0 GPA at the end of their junior year of high school.

Applicants may not:

- Be children or grandchildren of employees, officers or owners of Coca-Cola bottling companies, The Coca-Cola Company, Company divisions or subsidiaries.

PRIZING

Twenty Foot Locker Scholar Athletes will each receive \$20,000 in college scholarship money for their excellence in school, on their sports teams, and in their communities.

The scholarship will be awarded in four equal annual payments of \$5,000 throughout the winner's four-year college career.

This year, as a new addition to the program, one of our 20 winners will be selected for the Ken C. Hicks scholarship for demonstrating superior educational achievement, outstanding leadership, and a true love of the game. This winner will receive an additional \$5000 award (for a total of \$25,000). This student will receive their scholarship in four yearly installments, each of \$6,250.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to be eligible for the Foot Locker Scholar Athletes program, the applicant must:

- Be a current high school senior entering a four-year, accredited US college or university in the Fall of 2017
- Be currently a member (in good standing) of a high school sports team or be involved in after-school sports (e.g. intramurals, martial arts, etc.)
- have maintained an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher from ninth grade to first semester of 12th grade
- Be a U.S. citizen or US Permanent Legal Resident
- Foot Locker employees and their immediate family members are ineligible

For this scholarship, you will be required to answer the two essay questions below.:

Sports teach important lessons in leadership, teamwork, and sportsmanship. How have you embodied these qualities on your team and in your community? (Your community could include: your volunteer experiences, any leadership roles at your school or youth groups, and/or any other projects or efforts you think we should really know about!). Suggested length of 300-500 words.

Describe a defining moment in your life that has helped to shape your dreams and plans for the future. (Be sure to describe your academic/career goals and any challenges you've faced or are currently facing and how they have shaped your aspiration). Suggested length of 300-500 words.

The application due date is December 16, 2016 at 5PM EST (3PM MST).



Dennis Kay Memorial Scholarship 4 Year Agriculture

This four year, \$6,000 scholarship will be dispersed (to the student and at the end of each semester) as follows: \$500 per semester for years one and two. \$1,000 per semester for years three and four. Major must remain "AG Related" to qualify.

The four year scholarship will be renewed at the end of each semester upon proof of fulltime attendance and adequate grades. Student must have an accumulative 2.5 GPA for the first year and 2.75 for the following three years. With the exception of the summer session, the student must be enrolled in college full time and in consecutive semesters.

Mike Kelley Memorial Scholarship

This \$1,000 scholarship is dispersed (to the student and at the end of each semester) as follows: \$500 per semester pending submission of the previous semester's grades. A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required.

SCHOLARSHIP PRE-REQUISITES:

- ◆ The applicant or an immediate family member must be a member of the Monte Vista Co-op.
- ◆ Regardless of age, the applicant must be a high school graduate, have a GED or be a graduating senior, contingent upon graduation.
- ◆ A transcript of current grades is required.

- ◆ An "in-person" interview is required, pending completed scholarship. No phone interviews.

White Rose Scholarship

The White Rose Scholarship Foundation is an outreach program of the Rocky Mountain Court System, and the Imperial Court of The Rocky Mountain Empire; a gay / lesbian / transgender social service organization founded in 1973 in Denver, Colorado. Over the past 15 years, over \$200,000 has been awarded to a "rainbow" of people in order to assist in furthering their education. The White Rose Scholarship Foundation in no way discriminates against anyone on the basis of race, religion, creed, national origin, age, gender, or sexual orientation. Disbursements are given out in amounts ranging from \$500 to \$2500.

To be eligible for a White Rose Scholarship award, the candidate must: Be a United States citizen or permanent resident of the United States and resident of the State of Colorado for the past year-365 days. (If permanent resident, please attach a copy of residency card) Demonstrate financial need. (By submission of the first 2 pages of your Federal personal and parent's tax return) Furnish evidence of community involvement (i.e. school, church, civic, GLBT, etc.) Be admitted and enrolled in an institution of higher learning or attending an accredited technical or vocational school. Have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0, or GED.

CCHS/CR Volunteerism/Community Service Scholarship

The Colorado Council is comprised of many dedicated individuals throughout the state who give generously of their time and talents to help students achieve their higher educational goals. Without these volunteers, the Council would not exist.

To encourage and reward college-bound youth who likewise are committed to volunteerism and community service, the Council awards \$1,500 one-time scholarships to 16 deserving Colorado high school seniors each year to assist with defraying the cost of tuition and fees at one of the Member Institutions.

FSA ID Replaces FAFSA PIN Announcement

The United States Department of Education replaced the Financial Aid PIN (personal identification number) with an FSA ID effective Sunday, May 10. The FSA ID will consist of a username and password and will replace the PIN for students, parents, and loan borrowers.

If you are a new user, you will be asked to complete a registration form for your FSA ID. If you are a user with an existing PIN, upon logging on you will be sent directly to the FSA ID site and asked for your PIN number. If your information matches the information they have on file, your account will be linked directly to an FSA ID account. Please note, in order to have your current information link to your FSA ID, you must log on and go through the registration process.

The FSA ID, which consists of a user-created username and password, replaced the PIN effective May, 2015. It allows users to electronically access personal information on Federal Student Aid Web sites as well as electronically sign a FAFSA.
